Positions Vacant

Council for Lutheran Education (CLE) Membership – Business Manager Nomination

The CLE Terms of Reference that were adopted in 2014 provides for one Principal and one Business Manager (from different schools) nominated by Schools Assembly to CLE and recommended by CLE to the Vic/Tas District Church Council.

The term of office is for two (2) years (one Synodical term).

CLE members are to be communicant members of the Lutheran Church of Australia (where this criteria cannot be satisfied by the nominee, approval of the Vic/Tas District Bishop is required).

At the Schools Assembly meeting on 06 September 2014, John Aras, the Business Manager at Geelong Lutheran College, was recommended by Schools Assembly for appointment to CLE. Whilst John's nomination was accepted by the Bishop and approved by the Vic/Tas District Church Council, it has been necessary for John to subsequently withdraw his nomination for health reasons.

As such, a Business Manager appointment to CLE is still required for 2015 and 2016. We ask our schools to carefully consider a suitable replacement for John and for the **attached Nomination Form** to be completed and submitted to me at LEVNT by Friday, 30 January 2015. As this is a casual vacancy it will be filled by the Vic/Tas District Church Council on recommendation by CLE.

Warning: illegal downloading of films, games, music or software

Thank you to Derek Bartels for the timely reminder for all leaders and staff in Lutheran schools regarding illegal acts by downloading films, games, music or software from unauthorised sites.

Derek advised that **such illegal activities were highlighted when Columbia pictures and other film companies recently identified some internet services in Lutheran schools in Australia being used to commit piracy crime**. A number of serious infringement notices resulted.

A reminder to all that this is illegal and we have a responsibility to model to our students across Lutheran schools appropriate digital citizenship.

Please be aware that fines can range from \$50 000 per individual per offence and \$250 000 per offence for an organisation with up to 5 years

imprisonment.

Staff in Lutheran schools are asked to:

- utilise authorised ways to access content online (if you require help please contact me)
- check that your work or home computer is not inadvertently downloading pirated content due to lack of understanding of the law and software actions
- remove any peer to peer or bit torrent software from your work and home devices if they are not being used for lawful purposes
- remove and delete any content which has been obtained illegally
- educate others on authorised ways to access film, music etc. online

LEA federal news

***My School* updated with improved school attendance data [17 December 2014]**

The *My School* website has now been updated to include 2014 school attendance data collected in a consistent fashion and with the average student attendance rates reported for Indigenous students and non-Indigenous students. From 2015, this data, collated by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), will be reported twice a year along with a new measure of the proportion of students attending school more than 90 per cent of the time.

Minister for Education the Hon Christopher Pyne MP welcomed the data release which follows a decision by the Council of Australian Governments (COAG) in December 2013 to implement a range of measures to improve Indigenous school attendance.

"This data release is one element of our approach to ensure the stronger focus required to keep kids in schools and ensure safer communities," Mr Pyne said.

"I am pleased that all governments have agreed to work together on additional strategies to improve Indigenous school attendance in remote schools and communities, recognising this will lead to better education outcomes." "The initial release of this consistent data set is an exciting new start, and I look forward to the use of this data over time to identify and implement effective strategies to improve student outcomes in line with our *Students First* approach to implement practical initiatives that are known to work," he said.

2014 Naplan National Report Shows Stable Student Achievement Across Most Areas [10 December 2014]

The 2014 NAPLAN National Report provides a wealth of data and information that are used by schools, governments and education authorities to inform decisions about the education of young Australians. Following the release of the preliminary NAPLAN summary report in August, the 2014 NAPLAN National Report confirms the initial findings of the summary report, and that overall student achievement has remained stable for each year level and most domains.
